FORT INDIANTOWN GAP

MISSION

Fort Indiantown Gap is an Army National Guard maneuver training installation, one of only a handful across the U.S. The installation supports training for a variety of customers including Active Duty, Reserve, and National Guard Soldiers and Airmen, service members from the other branches of service, interagency partners at the federal, state and local level as well as multinational partners. Units come here to use the ranges and training grounds in preparation for their wartime mission. Additionally, the installation has been designated a FEMA point of distribution and operates the Pennsylvania National Guard's emergency operation center during state emergencies.

TRAINING GROUNDS

Weapon ranges: small arms, sniper, crew-served, anti-tank, indirect fire (artillery), aerial gunnery, air-to-ground bombing.

Urban Training sites: 1 km simulated town, forward operating base, 2.5 mile IED training road, structure collapse site, live fire shoot house, urban assault course.

Virtual Training: Aviation trainers, dismounted Soldier, truck trainer, simulated weapons.

Other sites include leadership reaction courses, land navigation and a variety of training areas that may be customized to meet unit training needs.

SUPPORT AND RECREATION FACILITIES

The installation has: dining facilities, barracks, temporary lodging, medical facilities, gym, pool, mini-PX, Subway, a community club, and recreation center. Additionally, the installation supports an active hunting and fishing club, as well as other outdoor recreation facilities.
